

UNDERSTANDING THE SCOREBOARD DIVING DISPLAY

The scoreboards purchased for the aquatic facilities are **Multi-Sport** boards. Primarily, they display time data. When we use the scoreboard for diving competitions, the display must use the basic configuration and adapt it for the needs of diving. The pictures below will explain what information you see for diving and where it appears on the scoreboard.

Swimming Mode:

The colons and decimal points are painted on the scoreboard and permanently placed.

Diving Mode:

There are two displays in diving: Before and after the judges' awards. Follow the descriptions below to see the differences.

Dive Order Number:

Indicates which diver is on the board. This order is determined prior to the meet and appears in the heat sheets.

Dive Number/Dive Award:

Before the dive is scored, this indicates the number of the dive being attempted (i.e. 401). After the judges scores are accepted, this indicates the total award for this dive only.

Judges' Scores:

After the dive is completed, the judges enter their scores on a key pad. When the scores are accepted by the computer operator, they are displayed here.

Degree of Difficulty:

Indicates the degree of difficulty for the current dive.

Total Score for Diver:

Before the dive is scored, this indicates the current total for the diver through all previous rounds. After the dive is scored, this displays the new accumulated total for all rounds.
